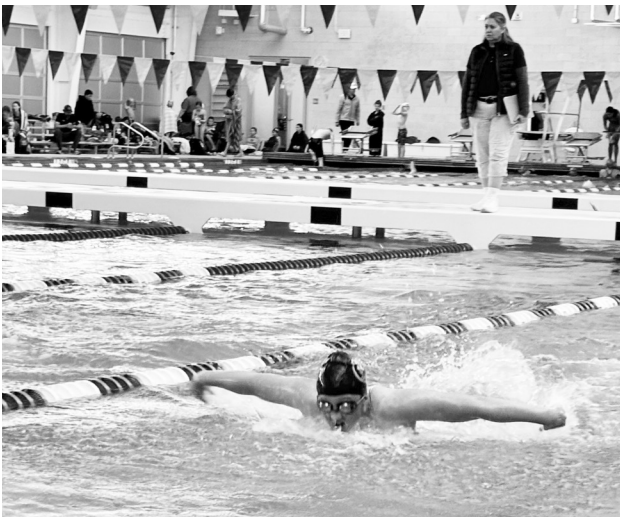
San Gabriel Aquatics competes in finals

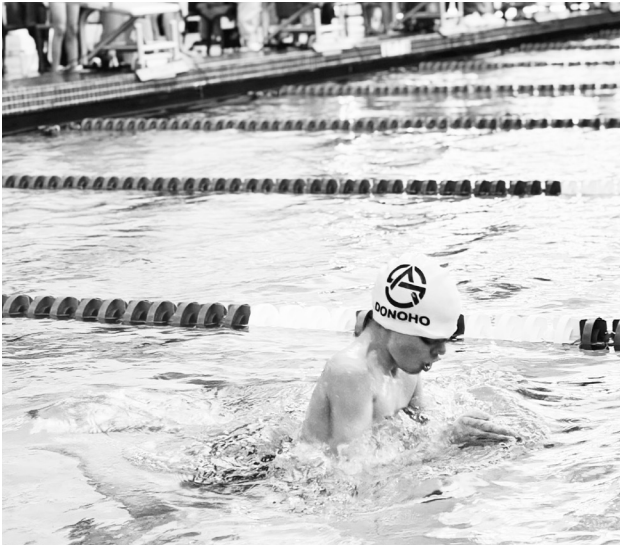
